

GREETINGS...

The Board of Directors and members of The Washington Group welcome you to TWG's Leadership Conference II.

The success of last year's first Leadership Conference and the positive feedback from the participants encouraged TWG to undertake this monumental task again this year. Coming on the threshhold of Ukraine's second millennium as a Christian nation, the Conference presents a unique opportunity for Ukrainian American professionals to reflect upon the past and help determine the future development of the Ukrainian American community.

To this end, the Conference offers -- within the framework of speakers, workshops, discussions, and social events – a forum for interested persons to come together, share their experiences and accomplishments, exchange ideas, identify objectives, and encourage and support the fulfillment of mutual goals. In addition this year, TWG plans to utilize the collective talents of the Conference's participants to publish a report defining the issues facing the Ukrainian community and proposing solutions. This report will then be used as a tool to provide a comprehensive perspective on Ukraine and Ukrainian Americans for Ukrainians and non-Ukrainians alike.

The expanded format of Leadership Conference II and the overwhelming response from participants across the country promise to make the weekend of October 9-12 in Washington, D.C. the occasion for a true Ukrainian "happening."

The response to Leadership Conference II mirrors the success of The Washington Group in its other endeavors. Established in 1984 with 54 charter members, TWG has continued to provide a forum for Americans of Ukrainian descent to participate in activities that promote their heritage, advance their professional growth, and allow for social interaction with others of common interests. Today, the group has grown to almost 300 members --the largest number yet – divided almost evenly between residents of the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area and those from the rest of the United States, Canada, Europe, and the Middle East. Varied in ages, professions, and experiences, TWG's members have a common interest -- their Ukrainian heritage, and a common desire -- interaction with other Ukrainian American professionals.

To promote the Ukrainian culture, history, and issues, TWG has taken full advantage of its location in the nation's capital and the varied expertise and talents of its members. In the past year, we have become involved in various issues, including anti-defamation, human rights, U.S.-U.S.S.R. relations and cultural exchanges, and follow-up on the nuclear disaster at Chornobyl, to

name a few. In our activities, we have brought our members together with government officials, journalists, academicians, and other influential persons in American life. For example, we were the first to introduce to the Ukrainian American community William H. Courtney, Consul General-Designate to Kiev; Jack F. Matlock, U.S. Ambassador to the Soviet Union; and Michael Edwards, Senior Editor of the *National Geographic* and author of two articles about Ukraine in the *Geographic*'s May 1987 issue. In our follow-up on Chornobyl, we brought together prominent Ukrainian and non-Ukrainian academicians, scientists, and government officials for two public symposia, and organized an InterFaith service to commemorate the first anniversary of the disaster with representatives of 13 denominations.

TWG has also continued to cooperate with other Ukrainian organizations. It coordinated the Chornobyl commemoration with the three parishes and six other organizations in the D.C. area. For the second year now, it has co-sponsored a fund-raiser cruise around Manhattan, with this year's proceeds going towards the restoration of the landmark Ukrainian Institute in New York City. Also for the second year, it is co-sponsoring a Gala with the Ukrainian American Bar Association to benefit the two organizations' respective fellowship and scholarship funds. TWG has been working with non-Ukrainian and other ethnic organizations as well.

For the benefit of its members, TWG publishes an informative and professional newsletter on a monthly basis. It also operates a job bank, organizes monthly Friday evening forums on a wide array of topics, and holds informal social events regularly. The TWG Directory of Members has proven to be an invaluable source of professional and personal contacts.

Having established a solid foundation of members, supporters, and volunteers, and a strong foothold in the community, TWG is now ready to turn its attention to long-term projects in addition to its other activities. The TWG Fellowship Fund was able to make two substantial awards for the first time this year. And, later this fall, we will be moving our operations into office space in downtown Washington in a joint venture with other Ukrainian and Baltic organizations, and intiating a "TWG hotline" -- a daily telephonic recording to inform interested persons quickly and effectively of upcoming events and activities.

This is an exciting time for TWG and its members, and we hope that you will support us according to your interests and talents. We also hope that your stay in Washington, D.C. and participation in Leadership Conference II will be informative, stimulating, rewarding, and enjoyable!

The Washington Group Fellowship Program

The Washington Group's presence in the nation's capital offers a unique opportunity for Ukrainian Americans. The Washington D.C. area contains a wealth of resources, human, organizational, as well as documentary — which have been underutilized in furthering Ukrainian American interests.

The Washington Group Fellowship Program was created to enable persons of Ukrainian descent in pursuing influential careers, as well as encourage people of any nationality to make use of Washington's resources to conduct research or work projects which will further Ukrainian-American interests.

TWG's Fellowship Program differs from that of other existing Ukrainian scholarship programs. TWG's program focuses beyond support of educational activity at a university and does not restrict its awards to full time students. It specifically encourages greater use of Washington's resources by a broader population.

In addition, TWG Fellowship Program collects and disseminates information on fellowships, grants, internships and summer study programs available in the Washington area.

The Fellowship Program presents an annual award, one or several, depending on the amount of funds available and merits of proposals submitted. Awards are made in amounts up to \$5000.

The recipients of the 1987 Fellowship Program award will be announced at the TWG-UABA Benefit-Gala, on October 10, 1987 at the Mayflower Hotel, Washington, D.C.

The first award is made to commemorate Alvin Kapusta, who died on January 25, 1987. Mr. Kapusta had a distinguished career at the Department of State including that of Special Assistant in Soviet Nationality Affairs. He was also a Slavic scholar and an expert on Ukrainian Baptists. Mr. Kapusta served on The Washington Group Board of Directors as Director of Public Relations.

We hope the recipients of these fellowships will be inspired by the drive and spirit exhibited by Mr. Kapusta in his work and by his contribution to the Ukrainian American community.

NOTES ON PARTICIPANTS

IHOR BEMKO - Ph.D. candidate at Texas A&M University and lecturer in American History. Bemko served as a staff researcher on the Commisssion on the Ukraine Famine, examining archives at the Department of State. He has a B.A. and an M. A. in History from Texas Tech University.

ANDREW BIHUN - Director of Market Analysis Division, International Trade Administration, Department of Commerce. Bihun is responsible for all over-seas commercial and market research. This includes analysis of the market for U.S. industries in the major countries of the world for all capital and consumer goods and services. Bihun has devoted most of his life to PLAST, currently serving as the "Stanychniy" of the D.C. area, and is a TWG member. He graduated from Georgetown University School of Foreign Service with a major in International Economics.

ANDRIJ BILYK - President, Continuum Communications, Inc. Bilyk, a public relations specialist and a writer worked as a reporter in Syracuse, New York before moving to Washington D.C. where he joined a trade association as a Assistant Managing Editor of the *Nation's Cities* magazine. Bilyk also worked in public relations and marketing for MCI, Inc. In 1984 Bilyk was the key public relations architect for the National Committee to Commemorate the Famine in Ukraine (1983), and the National Committee Against Russification in Ukraine (1984). He is presently the Public Relations Director for the National Committee to Commemorate the Millennium of Christianity in Kievan-Rus'.

JOSEPH CHARYNA - Organizer and Chairman of the Ukrainian Massachusetts Democratic Committee; member of the Finance Council, Gov. Michael S.Dukakis Presidential Campaign Committee. Charyna is retired from the Boston Redevelopment Authority, where he was a chief relocation and public relations officer. He has been active in city and state civic affairs, and has worked in most Democratic campaigns, including the late President John F. Kennedy's. Charyna's participation in Ukrainian community affairs includes positions as Supreme Officer of the Ukrainian Fraternal Association; past President and fund raising Co-Chairman of the Massachusetts Millennium Committee.

MARTHA BOHACHEVSKY-CHOMIAK - Program Officer, Research Division, National Endowment for the Humanities. Bohachevsky-Chomiak's responsibilities include promoting and encouraging research projects that make foreign language materials available to the English reading public. She has taught at Manhattanville College, the Johns Hopkins University and at Harvard University's Ukrainian Studies Institute. Now retired from full-time teaching, she is currently teaching one graduate-level seminar at George Washington University. Bohachevsky-Chomiak has published extensively and lectured on Russian intellectual history, Austrian, and Ukrainian history and women's

issues. Her latest book, Feminists Despite Themselves: Women in Ukrainian Community Life 1884-1939, will be released soon. She is Vice President of the National Council of Women of the U.S.A. and Vice President of the Ukrainian Women's League of North America. Bohachevsky-Chomiak holds a B.A. in History from the University of Pennsylvania, and an M.A. and Ph.D. from Columbia University. She is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, and the recipient of various awards and grants including the Woodrow Wilson and the IREX.

KATHERINE CHUMACHENKO - Special Assistant, Bureau of Human Rights and Humanitarian Affairs, Department of State. Chumachenko assists the Assistant Secretary of State in formulating policy on human rights issues. She is a former Director of the Ukrainian National Information Service, and the Executive Director of the National Captive Nations Committee. Chumachenko is on the Board of Directors of the U.C.C.A., Washington Branch. Chumachenko holds a B.S.F.S. from Georgetown University in International Economics and an M.B.A. from the University of Chicago.

BOHDAN DENYSYK - Senior Vice President, Global U.S.A. Inc. Denysyk has a Ph.D. from Union College; an M.S. from Catholic University; and a B.S. from Manhattan College. He has extensive professional experience in both government and private industry, including positions as Scientist at Naval Medical Research, Program Manager at the Naval Surface Weapons Lab, Department Head at EG&G, Inc., Deputy Assistant Secretary of Commerce, and Director of Federal Acquisitions at IBM. Currently, Denysyk is also Director of Coalition Development for the Dole for President Committee.

OREST DEYCHAKIWSKY - Staff Member, Commission on Security and Cooperation in Europe (Helsinki Commission). Deychakiwsky is responsible for the Commission's human contacts casework, and serves as the Bulgaria country desk officer. He was a member of the U.S. delegation to the Madrid, Vienna, and Bern Helsinki Review Meetings, the Ottawa Human Rights Experts Meeting, the Bern Human Contacts Experts Meeting and the Budapest Cultural Forum. Deychakiwsky graduated from the University of Notre Dame with a major in Government and International Relations, and holds an M.A. degree from Georgetown University. He is a Founding Member of TWG and has served on its Board of Directors and Auditing Committee.

JURIJ DOBCZANSKY - Slavic Cataloger of Social Science in the Subject Cataloging Division of the Library of Congress. Dobczansky has compiled an extensive bibliography on the Chornobyl nuclear accident, soon to be published by TWG. He is the founder of and librarian at the Ukrainian Catholic National Shrine Library, and a TWG member. Dobczansky received a B.A. in Comparative Literature from Holy Cross College and an M.L.S. from Catholic University.

OKSANA DRAGAN - Chief, Ukrainian Branch, Voice of America. Dragan received a B.A. in Journalism from Rutgers University, an M.A. in East European History from Columbia University, and is a Ph.D. candidate in American History at the University of Minnesota and Johns Hopkins University. She was a Fulbright Scholar in Vienna, studying the development of Ukrainian nationalism. Dragan has worked for Newsweek, the Ukrainian Weekly, and was an editor of VOL. I - Ukraine: a Concise Encyclopedia. Dragan is married to George Krawciw and has two children.

ANDREW FEDYNSKY - Senior Legislative Assistant to Congresswoman Mary Rose Oakar in the district office. Fedynsky works on economic development projects for Cleveland and the district. These projects include both public and private sector initiatives. Fedynsky started his political life as a grass roots organizer in the Ukrainian community in Cleveland, later doing translation of dissident writing for *Smoloskyp*, and representing that organization at various international human rights conferences. Fedynsky received a B.A. in English from the University of Notre Dame, and an M.A. in History from John Carroll University.

TATIANNA GAJECKY-WYNAR - Editor-in-Chief, Ukrainian Academic Press, Littleton, Colorado. She has taught Ukrainian and Ukrainian subjects, and has been a translator, editor, and illustrator for various publications and the Harvard Ukrainian Research Institute. She has had articles published in the *Encyclopedia of Library and Information Science*. Gajecky-Wynar is active in various Ukrainian organizations, including the Ukrainian National Women's League of North America; the Committee for the Defense of Political Prisoners in Ukraine; Plast; Providence; the Ukrainian Journalists Association of America; and The Washington Group.

PAUL A. GOBLE - Soviet Nationalities Affairs Analyst, Department of State, Bureau of Intelligence and Research. In that capacity, Goble follows and reports on developments in the non-Russian areas of the USSR. Prior to coming to the State Department, Goble was a Soviet affairs analyst at the Foreign Broadcast Information Service and the Central Intelligence Agency. He is the author of numerous publications. Goble received an A.B. summa cum laude at Miami University of Ohio, and an M.A. in Political Science from the University of Chicago. Holoyda holds a B.A. in Economics from the University of Wisconsin, a J.D. from the Columbus School of Law at Catholic University and an M.B.A. in Finance and Investments from George Washington University. Holoyda writes for various financial publications, and for the fifth year now, has been compiling a financial calendar - *The Broker's Book* - which is sold in the U.S., Canada and Switzerland. Holoyda is a member of the Illinois Bar, the Ukrainian-American Bar Association, and The Washington Group.

PATIENCE T. HUNTWORK - Founder and co-chairperson of the Independent Task Force on ABA-Soviet Relations. He clerked in Rochester, and was a Deputy Public Defender (Criminal) in Miricopa County, Arizona. He is also a former associate of Phillips and Lyon, a personal injury firm. Jejna is co-chairperson of the Independent Task Force on ABA-Soviet Relations. He is a member of the UABA Board of Governors and is active in the Phoenix Ukrainian community.

VICTOR MALAREK - Senior writer on social policy and issues for The Globe and Mail, Canada's national newspaper. In addition to these issues, Malarek has covered a wide range of foreign area topics. He has interviewed Afghanistan freedom fighters, on site, was a foreign correspondent in Iran during the American hostage crisis, spent two weeks with the Kurdish insurgents in Iran; and has traveled to Hong Kong, Vienna, and West and East Berlin to report on refugee and immigration issues. Malarek was the 1986 recipient of the Michener Award, Canada's most prestigious journalism award, for "meritorious public service in journalism" in his coverage of refugee and immigration problems. Malarek was also part of a team of Globe reporters who won the Michener Award for their reporting on child abuse and children's rights. Malarek's first book Hey Malarek! will be made into a feature film. Haven's Gate, Malarek's second book, will be released this fall. Malarek has not forgotten his Ukrainian roots. His provocative article on the Ukrainian Famine in the Globe brought a rash of protest from the Soviet Embassy in Ottawa. Malarek is married and has a two year old daughter.






