

Kateryna Kvasha - TWG/Embassy of Ukraine Summer Intern for 2026

Kateryna Kvasha, a student at Georgetown University, is the recipient of a Washington Group stipend in support of her participation in a summer 2026 internship at the Embassy of Ukraine in Washington, DC. The internship is a joint project of the Embassy and TWG. She was selected from a group of some twenty highly qualified applicants.

Ms. Kvasha, a native of Izium in the Kharkiv region of Ukraine, has completed her sophomore year at Georgetown's Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service. She is majoring in Science, Technology and International Affairs with a concentration in Security and her academic interests focus on international security, conflict studies and the role of emerging technologies in modern warfare. She is also pursuing a certificate in Eastern European, Eurasian and Russian Studies at the university. Kateryna's resume includes research and/or volunteering with the US Institute of Peace, the Wilson Center, Razom, the Ukrainian parliament and the Georgetown Ukrainian Society.

Kateryna Kvasha is the fourth recipient of a TWG Ukrainian Embassy internship stipend in the amount of \$3000, since the beginning of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022. Interns at the Embassy are tasked with:

- Attending and monitoring Ukraine-related events in Washington as assigned
- Research, writing and translation
- Assistance with organization of events and meetings at the Embassy or Ukraine House
- General office tasks and other duties as assigned

The sponsorship of the Embassy internship by The Washington Group reflects an important part of its mission: providing opportunities for college students and young professionals with an interest in Ukraine to gain additional expertise on Ukraine, U.S.-Ukraine relations and diplomacy in Washington. The internship is meant to provide a meaningful learning experience to an intern aspiring to explore career options as a foreign policy specialist engaged in Ukraine-related issues.
